We appreciated everything people gave, both in money, love and good wishes.

This all started in September 2015 and, although she was up and down, she had almost 6 more months of love and attention (Patricia took her *everywhere*). The love and kindness shown by the doctors and staff at the Pet Hospital in Orange was overwhelming and we and she will be forever thankful.
